Throughout 2022 as CEC and the nation **transitioned out of the COVID-19 pandemic**, it is with humility and gratitude that the Board of
Directors and I recognize the people who are responsible for CEC's
success. As restrictions lifted, the Board of Directors witnessed CEC's
administration, professional staff, and support staff's unrelenting
dedication to provide CEC patients and their families with the healthcare
and support services needed to navigate this "new normal."

As community members emerged from lockdowns and reentered a more social world, it became apparent that medical and behavioral healthcare support was needed to meet the magnitude of challenges individuals experienced during and post pandemic. Under Dr. James Dolan's leadership and the proactive and creative thinking of the CEC medical and behavioral health teams, CEC faced the challenges to meet community needs through a number of programs including:

- Project Hope
- · Increased Telehealth visits
- · Patient-driven team approach to care
- · Integrated care approach to patient care
- Residential placement for individuals needing more supportive assistance while experiencing mental health issues

Our vision for the future is for CEC to expand its outreach as a welcoming resource for health and wellness while embracing the diversity and culture of our communities. CEC is committed to improve patient and client care by providing:

- Functional, accessible and comforting facilities
- Outreach and continued collaboration with NYS Department of Health, NYS Office of Mental Health, NYS Office of Addiction Services and Supports, and Nassau County and Suffolk County human service agencies
- Surveys to patients, staff, members of the community, and policy makers to share their concerns and suggestions

The CEC family of providers epitomizes the belief that assessable, high-quality, and compassionate patient and client care are the essential components that define CEC's existence. MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Year 2022 was replete with remarkable accomplishments, all of which advanced CEC's ability to deliver high-quality care to vulnerable populations that had historically fallen thru the cracks of the health care system. In addition to the traditional services CEC provides, CEC has made significant investments in staffing and equipment in order to provide a range of services to people who may choose to receive care from the comfort of their home, or at another preferred community-based location.

The extent to which CEC provides care in various community settings has been enhanced by the growth of our Health Home – Care Management Program; and by the FEMA-funded "Project Hope" program that provided crisis counseling to the many that struggled psychologically from the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic. The Project Hope program ended in December of 2022 but was immediately replaced by an OMH grant funded program called Community Mental Health Promotion Services (COMHPS).

The above services when combined with other new funding received in 2022 from Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and the Mother Cabrini foundation, have enabled CEC to provide community outreach, assessments and referrals that are benefitting many who would otherwise continue to lack access to needed behavioral health, dental and medical care.

A key highlight was the June 21, 2022 Ribbon Cutting ceremony which ushered in the launching of our comprehensive health care center in Glen Cove. This accomplishment places CEC Glen Cove in the forefront of FQHC healthcare providers as the only location in NYS state where a person can receive NYS OMH licensed clinic services (Article 31), NYS OASAS licensed clinic services (Article 32) and NYS Department of Health treatment services (Article 28) all in one place. This integrated care model, which facilitates ease of access to a wide range of needed care, is the optimum care delivery approach for people who have been underserved.

It was also notable that in 2022 we received targeted funding from Nassau County to combat the opioid abuse epidemic. CEC will use these resources to improve service delivery linkages for people with substance use disorders who are defendants in the criminal court system.

CEC's commitment to continuous quality improvement and to the delivery of a patient-driven team approach to care was again recognized by the National Committee for Quality Assurance.

Additionally, CEC was proud to again be awarded with Patient Center Medical Home (PCMH) status.



CEC's Telehealth Program

CEC's Telehealth system was developed, tested, and introduced during 2022. Telehealth appointments are available for the following services:

- · Primary Medical Care
- Psychiatry
- Psychology
- Neurology
- Behavioral Health



Telehealth also offers existing patients the ability to receive rapid access to care via cell phones, tablets or computers, when visiting the office may not be possible. Patients can easily access this service by calling (516) 622-8888, anytime between 9:00 am and 3:00 pm, Monday-Friday.

CEC HealthCare Services

Medical, Dental and Behavioral Health Services (Article 28)

CEC is proud to provide quality healthcare regardless of a person's ability to pay. Our healthcare providers will provide the care that promotes healing and enables you to achieve your life goals.

Additionally, CEC's behavioral health team of highly trained psychiatrists, licensed clinical social workers, and psychiatric nurse practitioners and psychologists are dedicated to supporting each individual's recovery journey.

Mental Health Services (Article 31)

CEC provides comprehensive mental health services including assessment, diagnosis, and treatment for people with mental health and co-occurring addiction treatment concerns. We provide the highest quality care based on best practices and work collaboratively with those we serve to help assure that they attain mental health wellness.



Addiction Treatment Services (Article 32)

The CEC Addiction Treatment Outpatient Clinic is committed to improving community health by providing a full spectrum of services for individuals with addiction treatment concerns. CEC provides individualized treatment to empower clients to overcome the challenges of addiction and provide a path to support lasting recovery. Significant others involved gain an understanding of addiction and develop skills to support their loved ones and take care of themselves.

CEC Awarded Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and Mother Cabrini Foundation Grants

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), awarded CEC with the Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) grant. The CCBHC approach helps people with serious mental health, multiple chronic medical conditions and complex social support needs to achieve the best outcomes. The cornerstone of this model is based on whole-person treatment with a team of providers who specialize in each area of need.

Additionally, in 2022 the Charles Evans Center was awarded a grant from the Mother Cabrini Foundation to improve health outcomes for medically underserved communities in Nassau County by providing free health screenings, workshops on chronic health conditions, and by facilitating referrals to care. This grant enables those served to engage with health professionals to obtain culturally appropriate health information and health screenings with the goal of reducing health disparities.



Residential Programs and Events

The residential program at Charles Evans Center (CEC) remains dedicated to providing safe, secure and affordable housing to adults with Serious Mental Illness (SMI). The program consists of various levels of housing including Supervised Community Residences, Supportive Housing, Forensic Supportive Housing, and Crisis Respite. Residential staff work with recipients on targeted goals to ensure that they remain supported in the community.

Supervised Community Residences-Transitional Housing

CEC provides three single-site community residences. Services include medication monitoring, symptom management, rehabilitative activities, and community integration including transportation training, banking, shopping, socialization, and linkages to psychiatric and medical services in the community. Community residences are located in Glen Cove, Glen Head, and East Hills.

Supportive Housing

CEC provides residential support services that promote the recipients ability to live independently in a safe and supportive environment. Housing assistants work with our Federally Qualified Health Centers, MRS Team and Care Coordination to ensure that recipients can achieve their life goals.

Forensic Housing Program

The CEC Forensic Housing Program is unique in Nassau County as it provides affordable stable housing to recipients who have a legal history or are transitioning out of incarceration. Forensic staff work closely with probation and parole officers to link recipients to outpatient mental health, vocational, and socialization services to help advance the recipient's ability to live successfully in the community.

Mobile Residential Support Team (MRS)

MRS supports residents in the community by providing services at the person's home that promote their mental health and overall wellness. MRS works collaboratively with housing, mental health providers and state and local resources to ensure that recipients remain safely housed in the community.

Care Coordination

CEC's Care Coordination program provides community support to adults with serious mental illness. Care Coordinators partner with recipients to help connect them to the care they want to improve their health and support network.


CEC's 4th Annual Conference on "Promoting Brain Health"
